Register of the Land Office  
at Lincoln - Nebraska - where-

by it appears that - pursuant to the Act of Congress ap-  
proved 20th May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to Actual Set-  
tlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental  
thereto - the claim of Jacob Croy has been established and  
duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

West half of the North West quarter, of Section Twenty-  
six - in Township Twelve, North, of Range Seven, East  
in the District of Lands subject to sale at Lincoln,  
Nebraska, containing Eighty Acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said  
Land returned to the General Land Office by the Survey-  
or General.

Now know ye, That there is - therefore, granted by the  
United States unto the said Jacob Croy, the tract of Land  
above described; To have and to hold the said tract of  
Land - with the appurtenances thereof - unto the said Jacob Croy  
and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the  
United States of America have caused these letters to be  
made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to  
be hereunto affixed.

of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred  
and seventy five, and of the Independence of the United States the  
One hundredth.

\$15.00. Received of the American Telephone and Telegraph  
Company of Nebraska, Five 50 dollars in consideration  
of which we hereby grant unto said company, its suc-  
cessors and assigns, the right, privilege and authority  
to construct, operate and maintain its lines of telephon  
and telegraph including the necessary poles, wires  
and fixtures upon over and across the property which  
<sup>they may now or hereafter</sup>  
we own, which we have any interest in the Section 26  
addition, from 12 of N Range of E, County of Lancaster and State of Ne-  
braska, and upon and along the roads, streets or highways adjoining  
the said property, with the right to permit the attachment of the  
wires of any other company, and the right to trim any trees along said  
lines so as to keep the wires cleared at least eighteen inches to erect and  
set the necessary guy and brace poles and anchors and to attach there  
to and to trim the necessary guy wires; said sum being received in full  
payment therefore, and for right to cut down interfering trees, witness  
our hands and seal this 13th day of May A.D. 1909 at Rawlcock, Neb.
